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
Excursion Day

Today is the second excursion day, showing the contestants the relaxed side of the CEOI. After the second contest session, the contestants are surely ready for some leisure time. Today's events are the Duisburg-Nord park and a city sightseeing tour in Cologne. After the tour, the contestants are free to move around in the city of Cologne.



Duisburg-Nord park & Cologne

The **Duisburg-Nord park** was used from 1908 until 1985 as an ore mine. More than 37 million tons of iron were mined here. Today, it is a unique park. Combining the green from the trees with the grey color with the old facilities, offering leisure where, years ago, once was worked really hard. The contestants will explore some of the history of the Ruhr area, where an industry emerged. They will enjoy sports and free-time in the midst of nature.





Cologne is the oldest major city in Germany. The name Cologne stems from the Roman empress Agrippina. The wife of the Emperor Claudius was born on the banks of the Rhine and elevated her "Colonia" to the status of a city in the year 50 A.D. Today, traces of the Romans are still to be found at every turn in Cologne: the Dionysus mosaic in the Römisch-Germanisches Museum, sections of the Roman city wall and the Roman water system, which formerly brought fresh spring water to the Roman city from the Eifel region.





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
Cologne has been one of the most important European traffic junctions for more than 2,000 years, once forming a key intersection of the major roads of the Roman Empire, and is located on the main historical mediaeval trade routes.

Cologne is the largest city in North Rhine-Westphalia, the largest German Federal State by population. It has a central location in the largest economic region in Western Europe. Twenty million people live within one hour's drive from Cologne. The dynamic Rhine-Ruhr region is one of the central locations in Europe for industry, trade, the economy, science and research. Together with the adjacent Netherlands, Belgium and Luxemburg, it generates more than 40 per cent of the European Union's total gross domestic product.

At the same time, the Federal State and its structures have undergone a transformation in recent decades. Where

coal and steel once predominated, are now centres of growth sectors, specialising in multimedia, telecommunications, media and culture.
